CALL TO ORDER AND DECLARATION OF QUORUM

Notice of this meeting was posted with the Secretary of State's Office and on the NET RMA website and office on Friday, October 7, 2016.

Chair Thomas called the meeting to order at 1:34pm.

2. INVOCATION

Gary Halbrooks offered the invocation.

3. WELCOME & INTRODUCTION OF BOARD MEMBERS

Judge Davis welcomed the Board to Cherokee County. He said he is proud of the job that the NETRMA has done for the East Texas area, reminding everyone that Cherokee County is very involved in Texas transportation with Jeff Austin 3 and Senator Nichols both being from here.

4. OPEN PUBLIC FORUM/COMMENT PERIOD

Chair Thomas introduced Jeff Austin 3 as the 'Father of the NET RMA'. Mr. Austin welcomed the board to Jacksonville. He said he was proud of the work the NET RMA is doing and stated that projects with regional impact and support are what RMA's are all about. He stated that Cherokee county will need some help for the I-69 project which will provide hurricane evacuation relief with a loop around Jacksonville. He also said that the Hwy 271 project that TxDOT is undertaking is very important, to connect I-20 to I-30 with 4 lane improvements. He stated that the NET RMA's influence and support on different projects helps ensure their success. He mentioned that there is a tough session coming up in the legislature with lots of projects that won't have the grass roots regional community support like Toll 49 and NET RMA projects, and he is greatly appreciative of the work and support of Madame Chair Thomas and the entire NET RMA board. The question was asked 'How can we be more regional?' and Mr. Austin said for instance on the 271 project, highlighting the connectivity, garnering the support of the County Judges, School Districts and general users ensures success.

11. PRESENTATION ON TXDOT PLANS FOR US 271.

Titus County Judge Brian Lee Hudson Old Shane Cunningham (TxDOT)

Tyler District and Atlanta District projects were presented, including Hwy 271 project which is projected to complete in 2025, with details contained within the maps presented.

Segments 6, 7 & 8 were given attention with ways to move forward and various ways to fund. The engineering and environmentals are projected to cost \$4-\$5 million for Segment 6.

13. REPORT ON MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES ON SEGMENT 3B OF TOLL 49.

Kate Wilder

Segment 3B overlay project consisting of under-drain/overlay of pavement is complete.

Spot milling and inlay is set for Jan thru March. Pavement repairs will be limited during cold months.

14. SAFETY UPDATE ON SEGMENT 3B AND SEGMENT 4 OF TOLL 49.

Chris Miller/Everett Owen

Everett Owen stated that median options are shown on Attachment A in the next resolution (below).

- 1) 4 ft flush medians with 4 ft pavement on the entire road, including bridges. It would take roughly 1.5 years to widen the bridges at a cost of roughly \$4.3 mil
- 2) 2 ft separation/flush median with the shoulders narrowing from 8ft to 7ft all the way at a cost of \$800k.
- 3) 4 ft flush median with rumble strips, increase pavement 4 ft except for bridges at a cost of roughly \$2 million. This would be:
 - a. 12 ft lanes
 - b. 4 ft median
 - c. 6 ft shoulders

Mr. Messer asked if we had cash flow to accommodate these options, and the answer is yes.

Mr. Fulmer asked how this affects passing lanes in the future, and the answer is that this configuration would be factored in to the addition of passing lanes when that time comes.

Dr. Harris asked if there is evidence that 4 ft medians are safer than 2 ft medians, and the answer is yes.

15. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO PURSUE OPTIONS FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF SAFETY MEASURES ON SEGMENT 3B OF TOLL 49.

Mr. Cloutier made the motion that the board approve option 3 above. 2nd Dave Spurrier. Mr. Old asked if there would be signage indicating that the shoulders are narrowing on the bridges, and the answer is yes. Unanimously approved.

Weston Harper offered his gratitude to the Board for their consideration and strong and swift action on these safety measures.

Mr. Fulmer asked what is different about the erosion control that will cost \$157k more. This is an attempt to mitigate future sediment run-off, and ensures that the contractor has what is needed IF they need it.

21. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE A CONTINUING DISCLOSURE CONTRACT WITH FSC CONTINUING DISCLOSURE SERVICES.

Action Item

Richard Ramirez explained the disclosure process as a part of the bond agreement, consisting of 3 areas:

- 1) Annual fund
- 2) OS updating reports
- 3) Progress on construction quarterly

Costs are \$4500 per year.

Mr. Old stated that the legal fees to for writing resolutions is around \$25k just to write all these up.

The response was there is a lot of legal involvement in the significant detail of the disclosures agreement as required by the bond market. Tolling policies require some involvement in getting the language right to protect the interests of the NET RMA. There are items that simply require legal oversight. Mr. Fulmer stated that the disclosures regulations are so specific that even large firms hire it out. Mr. Cloutier stated that it's important to get it right because one 'dang' can wipe out 10 'atta-boys' and we can't afford to trip up at this point.

22. DISCUSSION OF MSB CUSTOMER SERVICE PERFORMANCE INDICATORS.

Ron Fagan

Mr. Fagan presented the KPI's on MSB's Customer Service Performance Indicators and all fields fell will within the industry averages. Fields included wait time, abandonment rate, customer satisfaction, monthly percentage of escalations.

When the RFQ/RFP is released, we can certainly ask for higher standards. He explained that MSB's performance numbers are affected by:

- 1) Most call centers have multiple issues that they are handling, and MSB is only taking payments for PBM (Pay By Mail) invoices, either taking payments, mitigating disputes, etc.
- 2) Numbers are also influenced by ripples in other vendors, like the DMV issue and the TxTAG issue.

23. PROJECT DIRECTOR'S REPORT

A. Report on Toll 49 Tolling Transactions and Revenue

Transactions in September saw a slight rebound and an upward trend is continuing over last year. Fridays are still the peak, Sundays are still the lows.

Pursuant to Section 3.4.1 of the NET RMA Toll Policies, the Toll Rate Escalation Percentage was reported to the Board. We are set for another Toll Rate increase effective on December 31, in keeping with the 2.5% inflation and rate adjustment in the agreement with the bond market and T&R report.
