NET RMA BOARD DISCUSSES CONTINUED PROGRESS FOR DESIGN-BUILD AGREEMENT FOR TOLL 49 SEGMENT 3B PROJECT AND BOARD RESIGNATIONS

Mineola, Texas – January 26, 2010 – The North East Texas Regional Mobility Authority (NET RMA) Board of Directors met Tuesday for its Board Meeting at the Mineola City Hall in Mineola, Texas. Among the topics of discussion were the continued procurement for the Toll 49 Segment 3B project through a Design/Build Comprehensive Development Agreement (CDA) and the resignation of two board members, Jamal Moharer, Smith County and John Cloutier, Rusk County.

Loop 571 was an additional accomplishment that John Cloutier embraced. He worked with Rusk County and assisted the city of Henderson to ensure the project kept its momentum. "John has been a great asset to the NET RMA and Rusk County and I'm proud of all of his accomplishments during his tenure," said Chairman Jeff Austin, III.

Jamal Moharer, also resigned from his position on the board. Jamal has been instrumental in the development of the proposal to TxDOT for a multi-modal transportation center in Smith County. The facility will be a hub for rail, bus and taxi services among others. "Transportation is vital for our lives, without it we are at a stand-still. This is about connectivity," Jamal Moharer said. He has worked with many local corporations and governmental agencies to gain their support for the facility in Smith County. He has received financial support for the project and has submitted a grant to TxDOT for funding so the facility can become a reality for Smith County. "Jamal's dedication to transportation throughout all of East Texas has been unparalleled. We congratulate you on all of your efforts," said Chairman Jeff Austin, III.
